about the museum center



and its history. Some of the highlights were:

- Construction of Union Terminal building was completed in March 1933.
- In 1972 trains stopped using the building as a terminal. However, Amtrak started using it again in 1991 and continues to use it today.
- The Museum Center at Union Terminal opened in 1990 and has about a million visitors a year.
- It consists of 3 museums: Cincinnati History, Natural History and the Children's Museum.
- In addition they have an Omnimax Theater and host travelling Exhibits. They are currently hosting the "Dead Sea Scrolls" until April 14th.

- They also host the Historical Society which can be helpful in genealogy research.
- Have many membership types and prices. The basic membership costs \$100 per year
