Vic Johansen attended the monthly breakfast meeting of The U.S.S. Hornet Club of World War-II Veterans at The Colerain Avenue IHOP last Friday with Tom Griffin, John Murphy, Clint Seitz, and Russ Witte and seventy other veterans, and later that same day he was found dead by his wife Carole at the bottom of the stairs in their home on South Road. He was 84 years old.

Vic was born in Brooklyn, N.Y. and left high school to join the Navy in 1943, serving our country on a destroyer with honor until 1946, then in the Reserves, 1947-1952. He worked for AT&T from 1948-1978, retiring after thirty years. He married his high school sweetheart, Geraldine, who died in 1998. They had two sons and two daughters, one son and one daughter of whom preceded Vic in death. Vic married Carole in 1999 and they enjoyed dancing, dining out, stage shows, short trips and time with their families which included grand, great grand, and a great great grandchildren, also enjoying friends, church groups and a senior citizen group.
